When others critique your personal narrative essay, have them address the following:

- Is the topic interesting? Does the introductory paragraph whet your appetite for the rest of the paper?
- Does the narration have a theme (or implied thesis)? Does the essay express a point rather than simply recount a story?
- Does the narration focus on important scenes? Is the pacing effective?
- Does the narrative include vivid details to describe people, places and events?
- What do you like best about the essay?
- Offer suggestions for improvement.

Evaluate the processes you used in creating your essay, incorporating the questions below. **Submit this self-evaluation** with your final draft.

Self-Evaluation Questions

- 1. Did you stick with your original topic or did you change it along the way? Why?
- 2. What problems did you encounter during the process of creating the essay?
- 3. List two of the most important changes you made. Why did you make them?
- 4. What part of your essay are you most proud of? Why?

Do not lose these questions. You will submit a self-evaluation routinely with each major composition.
